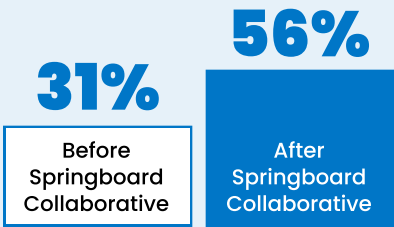

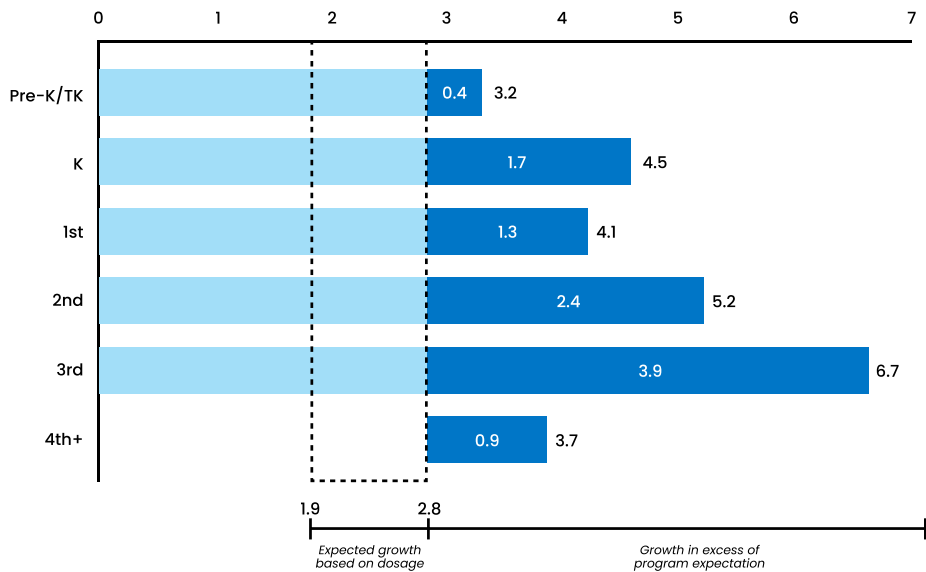

Students reading at or above grade level nearly doubled

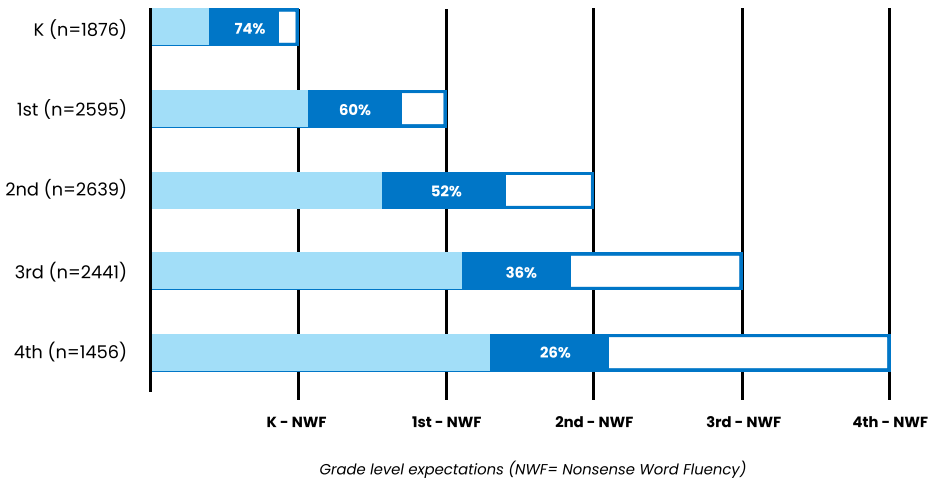


Months of reading growth in 7–10 weeks

BEFORE SPRINGBOARD COLLABORATIVE

Children spent **13 minutes** reading at home every day on average

Children spent **21 minutes** reading at home every day on average

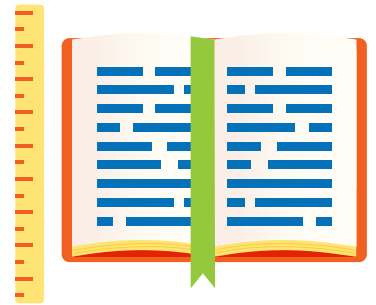
